Medicare covers chiropractic procedures, but the criteria are extremely specific. Medicare will only cover chiropractic care as a treatment for a condition called spinal subluxation.

Medicare defines the phrase "medically necessary" as "services or supplies needed to diagnose or treat an illness, injury, condition, disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of medicine." In a nutshell, this means that if chiropractic treatment has been recommended for you by a licensed medical doctor, Medicare Part B will cover a portion of the payments.

According to the CMS, Medicare Part B covers 80% of chiropractic services for the "manipulation of the spine if medically necessary to correct a subluxation." Furthermore, you can go as many times to the chiropractor as long as it's medically necessary.

The only chiropractic service covered by Medicare is manual manipulation of the spine to correct subluxation. Subluxation of the spine is when one or more of the bones of your spine move out of position. This is covered by Medicare Part B (medical insurance) in instances where it is medically necessary and provided by a chiropractor or other qualified provider. You do not need an X-ray to ...

If Medicare does pay for your treatment, it will cover 80% of the cost, while you will owe the remaining 20%. Medigap insurance may cover this remaining portion. Medicare Part B covers only Chiropractic care for subluxation, but if you have a Medicare Advantage Plan (Medicare Part C), your plan may cover a broader range of chiropractic services ...

Keep in mind that Medicare covers 80% of the Medicare-approved amount, so you're still responsible for the remaining 20%, and your Part B deductible applies. Any other chiropractic services you might need – like X-rays, massage therapy, maintenance care, preventative wellness, and acupuncture – are not covered at all by Medicare.
